Unit board elections

# District 17 elections

The Denver Unit has two representatives to the District 17 board. Currently they are Pete Heber and Ginny Johnston. Pete's term expires at the end of 2002 and has chosen to not seek reelection.

Pete has done a wonderful job at representing us at the District level and we thank you Pete, for your years of dedicated service.

We had one nominee for this position, so running unopposed is Carolyn Newcomb. We are thrilled to have Carolyn as one of our District representatives. She and Ginny will provide excellent representation, listening to the Unit and carrying our message to the District. Carolyn served on the Unit board in the recent past, so it's good to have her back.

# Regional 2003

Many of you may be aware that the Unit board submitted a proposal to the District

to change our regional starting times. This proposal had the main events at 10:00am and 3:00pm, with an 8:00pm time slot for those events currently held at 8:45am.

The District tabled our proposed 2003 regional schedule until their October Board meeting, to be held at the Colorado Springs regional. In the meantime, the Denver Unit spent the summer months further researching the 10-3-8 subject. The survey in the Forum that some of you responded to was just one means of information gathering we implemented.

Without going into great detail, the Unit determined that the uncertainties of a 10-3-8 schedule warranted not assuming the risk at this time. The Unit has resubmitted a schedule to the District that is very similar to past Denver regionals with a few slight modifications.

The Denver regional has seen increased attendance from the prior year just five times since 1992. Two of those increases came in 2001 and 2002. We hope 2003 can boast another attendance increase, so mark your calendars – May 21-26, 2003, Renaissance Denver Hotel. Plan to play, and play often. We intend to make your experience enjoyable.

# Bridge Week 2003

The ACBL has declared January 6-12, 2003 as **Bridge Week in North America**. It marks the 71st anniversary of the Culbertson-Lenz match, dubbed Bridge Battle of the Century. It was this match that helped make bridge a national pastime 71 years ago, and the goal of Bridge Week is to spread the word that bridge is still the best leisure-time activity in the world.

All clubs are invited to participate in this week-long celebration. Since our Winter sectional falls within this week, the Unit may even catch the Bridge Week bug.

# **ABSENTEE VOTING**

(Please read carefully and follow instructions.)

Absentee voting shall be allowed for the following reasons only:

- 1) illness
- 2) absence from the Denver Election Tournament

Absentee ballots may be obtained by requesting same from the Secretary of the Board. The only absentee ballots which shall be accepted are those which are printed by the Board. Copies or facsimiles shall be discarded. Such ballots must be mailed or otherwise submitted to the Secretary of the Unit to reach him no later than the day before the election meeting. Absentee ballots shall be enclosed in a plain envelope and shall be accompanied by a letter showing the name of the member and ACBL number and stating the member is in good standing and one who wishes to avail himself of absentee voting privileges for one or the other of the two reasons allowed. Nowhere on the ballot or in the plain envelope which contains the ballot should the member be identified. Ballots must be received by Wednesday, November 6, 2002.

# **Kudos to Players with High Standards of Ethics**

Here are some examples of situations where people displayed high standards of ethics knowing that by doing so they would hurt their score.

# **Hesitation Blackwood**

Fred Herring, one of Denver's finest players, recently picked up:

- **^**7
- **♥**KQ963
- ◆ KJ9
- ♣AQ87

He opened the bidding with  $1 \checkmark$  and his partner (an improving but relatively inexperienced player) responded  $1 \spadesuit$ . He rebid  $2 \clubsuit$  and his partner asked for aces with a complicated form of Blackwood. He responded and then his partner hesitated before bidding  $5 \checkmark$ . Realizing that there was probably a mix-up and that he could most likely make  $6 \checkmark$  (after all, he did have a great hand with lots of extra values) — he passed. Yes, the hand was cold for  $6 \checkmark$  without finesse.

# **Hesitation Redouble**

A number of years ago Flo Newlin was playing in a regional event with an expert partner. Flo opened 1NT which the next hand doubled for penalties. Now there are at least two ways to interpret a redouble by responder. The standard method is that a redouble says "gotcha." It is also possible to play that redouble asks the NT bidder to run to a suit. The second method requires partnership agreement and perhaps some advance discussion. Well her partner did redouble but only after thinking about it for maybe 20-30 seconds. Now the hesitation told Flo that her partner did not have values and wanted her to run, although this was not clearly their agreement. So of course Flo passed just as if the redouble had been made in tempo. I wish I could report that justice was served and she made the contract but I believe it was down one.

# **Hesitation Non-Blackwood**

In the last round of a sectional Swiss event when she was playing for an overall award, Susan Reynolds picked up a great balanced hand including a very good 5-card club suit. She opened 2NT and her partner (a nice player but perhaps tired by this time) bid 3♣ which was alerted and explained as Puppet Stayman, asking for a 5-card major. Susan bid 4. Her partner thought for awhile and bid a slow 4NT (wanting to play it there). Susan responded Aces and her partner thought for some time and bid 5NT (clearly wanting to play it here since 4NT and 3NT were no longer available). Susan answered Kings. She ended up playing 6NT which had no play.

# **Hesitation Pass**

In a recent club game an intermediate player who is improving faced the following situation. The bidding had gone 1NT, pass by her partner, 3NT by her right hand opponent. She held a fair hand with a good spade suit and thought awhile before passing. When it was explained to her that she could think as long as she liked (well, probably not 5 minutes), but by doing so she put a lot of pressure on her partner. Why? The hesitation in 4th seat is usually based on a good major (the opponents did not bid Stavman). It behooves her partner to defend as if there were no hesitation – difficult to do and to not lead a doubleton 9 of spades, say, against the 3NT contract when she might have picked that lead had there been no hesitation. She is now prepared to think before a hesitation becomes necessary.

# Conclusion

We all need to try to not hesitate in situations where doing so indicates a course of action to our partners. In addition, if your partner accidentally does hesitate, be careful how you bid and play after the hesitation.

# BRIDGE WEEK IN NORTH AMERICA

The second week in January of 2003 has been *declared* "Bridge Week in North America - 2003 by the American Contract Bridge League. With over 160,000 members, ACBL selected this week because it is the 71st anniversary of the "Bridge Battle of the Century."

The Bridge Battle of the Century, as it was called when it took place between December 1931 and January 1932, was a genuine milestone in the history of the development and promotion of bridge as it is known today. Combining as it did every feature designed to capture and hold the interest of the then bridge-mad multitudes, and starring the greatest celebrities then prominent in bridge, it was predestined to be an exciting and long-remembered event. These were the years when bridge was making its impact felt keenly in the United States for the first time.

Well it may be a new millennium now but bridge is still a fantastic game and with the advent of the internet and online bridge clubs, it is more accessible than ever.

To celebrate our game, bridge clubs throughout the world and cyberspace are invited to participate in "Bridge Week 2003." Bridge clubs are going to be where "the action is" for Bridge Week. Highlighting this event will be the Continent-wide Member/Non-member Contest. At all duplicate games during the week, any pair that contains at least one new member (paid after January 1, 2003) will count toward determining prize winners in the recruiting contest — details to be announced soon.

Other features of the week-long event will be a "pro-am competition" where games made up only of pairs of over/under 300 points (the entire field must be that way) will be a featured competition. Also, hand records with hands from the famous match will be available to any ACBL club de-

siring them. And special prizes to clubs conducting a "bridge marathon" based on the number of hands actually played at the club during the week with the aim being to get local news media coverage wherever possible.

Mark the dates on your calendars. Expect more information on the internet at <a href="www.acbl.org">www.acbl.org</a> and in a mailing in the fall. If you have ideas for Bridge Week in North America, email bridgeweek@acbl.org.

There will be bridge marathons, member/guest & pro-am games and a re-creation of the Culbertson/Lenz match as well as "party time" at the clubs. Prizes will be awarded in various categories. The goal of the weeklong celebration is to spread the word that *bridge* is the best leisure time activity in the world.

To receive the special Bridge Week packet of promotional materials and prizes, a club must register to participate in one or more of the Bridge Week activities with the ACBL Club Membership Department no later than November 1, 2002. Easiest way to sign up is through the ACBL website. Note that the special pro/am and member/nonmember games will have upgraded masterpoint awards.



# Finding the Queen where you want it



This hand appeared recently in a column by Steve Becker. The deal occurred in a team-of-four match where making the contract is paramount, and illustrates not only a clever play by declarer which had much to gain and little to lose, but also shows a strategic difference between IMPS and matchpoints.

At the first table South got to 3NT and West led a diamond, declarer winning East's jack with the queen. South had seven quick winners and needed tricks from the heart suit, so at trick two he let the ten of hearts ride.

Had West held the queen, South would have made the contract with an overtrick. But East won the ten with the queen and returned his remaining diamond. West's diamonds were established, and declarer ultimately went down one.

The bidding and play at the other table were exactly the same, but that declarer made the contract. He won the diamond lead with the queen, led a spade to dummy's queen, and returned a low heart toward his hand. East followed low, as most players would, and South played the ten. West ducked, hoping to preserve his entry to his diamonds, but it was of little use.

Declarer led another heart and West ducked again. But South, having already located the queen of hearts, went up with the king. Another heart lead forced out the ace, and declarer made ten tricks.

Despite the unusual nature of the second declarer's play, it had an extremely sound foundation. South did not mind losing a trick to West if he had the queen, since the diamonds would be safe from attack. Declarer's only real concern was that East might have the heart queen.

In effect, South assumed that East did have that card and there was an excellent chance he might not play it if the first heart lead came from dummy. And if West had it, declarer has lost only an overtrick, but his contract is safe.
