## Recipe for a Successful Bridge Tournament <br> by Kristi Endelicato, President

Why do you play bridge? The answer to that question will reveal exactly what we need to know to host a successful bridge tournament. The only problem-there isn't one answer-there are many answers to that question. Let's investigate.

Reasons people play bridge:

1. for fun
2. the challenge
3. competition
4. geographical proximity
5. meet people/make new friends
6. social interaction
7. an inexpensive activity
8. to kill 4-5 hours
9. to get out of the house
10. mental stimulation/maintain \& improve mental faculties
11. it's their job
12.

Now, in constructing this recipe for a successful bridge tournament, we find that we need to do the following:

1. for fun-provide a pleasant atmosphere that promotes friendliness, has comfortable temperature levels, good lighting and other amenities
2. the challenge-provide and enforce a set of rules and regulations to be practiced by all participants
3. competition-provide a field of competitive players (this includes all skill levels; Strat A players do not constitute a "competitive field" for Strat C players, and vice versa)
4. geographical proximity-hold the tournament in your neighborhood or make it easy to get to if it's not
5. meet people/make new friendsfind a partner for anyone who asks; get lots of people to play, lots of "friendly" people
6. social interaction-get lots of people to play, lots of "friendly" people
7. an inexpensive activity-charge reasonable entry fees, provide free snacks, free coffee, free sodas, free candy (if possible)
8. to kill 4-5 hours-provide 3-31/2 hours of bridge (the balance is drive time)
9. to get out of the house-hold your tournament at a public place, not at home 10. mental stimulation/maintain \& improve mental faculties-the game of bridge provides the opportunity for mental gymnastics; therefore, play bridge at your tournament
10. it's their job-????
11. (your reason for playing bridge)

It sounds simple enough, or at least reasonable to be able to pull all these ingredients together. It's certainly not rocket science.

So why isn't every bridge tournament a success? No. 12.

If you don't know why people come to your bridge tournament, how can you provide it?

Denver has had some successful bridge tournaments in the recent past. Our November 2003 tournament drew 458 tables, a record for Denver and in (or very near) the Top 10 sectionals in the US and Canada (700+ sectionals). On the heels of that success, our January 2004 tournament had $468 \frac{1}{2}$ tables.

The recipe for a successful bridge tournament? I wish we knew.

## The Proper Play and a Little Luck

Playing matchpoints I hold －A976 vulnerable，LHO is dealer and bids 1－，partner doubles，RHO passes． Thinking I can＇t bid one lousy spade with two aces and a worthwhile doubleton，I try 24．Partner raises to 34．Since I＇m sure that if four spades were a worthwhile contract partner would have bid it，I＇m happy to pass．$\$ \mathrm{~K}$ is lead，and I see this：

I am now rather sorry about the whole thing，but at least I only have four clear losers，assuming spades break 3－2．RHO plays the 9 which looks like a doubleton，and I have to figure out how to hold my losers to four．

If I win the first diamond trick， lose a diamond then ruff a diamond in dummy，I might get overruffed by a doubleton spade which would make five losers．If I win the first diamond，pull two rounds of trump then lose a diamond，they might be able to draw a third round of trump which would leave me one trick short．

I decide to duck the diamond （to cut their communication）and LHO continues with the Q $\downarrow$ ，RHO plays the 6 and I win the trick．

If I play two rounds of spades then ruff a diamond I can＇t get back to my hand without letting them in to cash the third trump．So I lead a club from my hand and cover what－ ever LHO plays since RHO has no damaging lead．RHO wins and plays a heart which I win，then I play two rounds of trump．Now I can crossruff clubs and diamonds and they can take their high spade any－ time．

LHO held the following：$\$$ Q108 QQ7 KQJ105 KK104，so if I vary the play in any substantial way I would have been down．If I had bid only one spade，partner might have raised（although he shouldn＇t），and I would have happily bid four．As it was，I was lucky partner bid only three．
