The new slate of board members will be presented at the November annual meeting. I, along with Chuck Anderson, Maxine Divine, Don Heitler, and Jerry Newcomb will finish our two-year terms in 2009-2010.

A special thanks to all the volunteers helping us with sectionals and regionals (see Jerry's column). And a special thanks to our great hospitality chairman, Maxine Divine. We truly have the "best hospitality in the west."

At the Newcomer-Intermediate Tournament in April THE TRAVELING SUSAN DITTMER MEMORIAL TROPHY was awarded for the most master points earned in the two-day event. The winners were Marjorie McDonald of Castle Rock, CO and Linda Washburn of Larkspur, CO.

FRONT RANGE CHALLENGE WIN-NER....The event was held on Saturday, September 26, 2009 in Colorado Springs. The winner for 2009-2010 is DENVER. Thank you, Colorado Springs for being such gracious hosts. The event consisted of four strats. The 32 teams played pairs in the morning and Swiss Teams in the afternoon.



Denver Regional May 25-31, 2010 From Jerry Newcomb, Chair, Denver Regional

We are looking forward to another successful regional in 2010. Our attendance in 2009 was 2,073 tables, making us the second largest District 17 Regional tournament behind Las Vegas. 2008 was a banner year with 2,213 tables. Our Unit had a surplus of nearly \$10,000 on our Regional in 2009. This money is used to produce our Table Talks, directories, support two I/N Tournaments and provide us with a healthy financial position.

Once again, the tournament will be held at the Renaissance Hotel at Stapleton. We are in the process of renewing our contracts with that hotel through 2015. Recent renovations make it a wonderful in-town vacation.

One reason for our success is the attention we pay to our newer players. ACBL members with fewer than 5 master points play free. A reception is held for newer players to give them a chance to mingle. Another reason we are so successful is the willingness of our unit members to help the tournament chairs and volunteer in many capacities to make people feel welcome at our tournament. Thank you for helping us make the hospitality desk, partnership and photographer available before the games.

By adding a single session Swiss Team event on Wednesday at 9:00 a.m. on the advice of Gary Zeiger, Tournament Director there will be a team event available for every session during the tournament.

Our Open Daylight pairs continues to be very popular event and makes us somewhat unique as most tournaments restrict this event to Seniors. Board-A-Match is another event unavailable at other tournaments. It is played much like a pairs game, but each board's results are compared with only one other team; if you win the board, you get one point, lose it, get a zero. Try it if you haven't.

Congratulations to the 385 people who qualified for the NAP District 17 Finals in Unit 361 Bridge Clubs this year! But what does that mean?

The months of June, July and August are the start of the Annual North American Pairs (NAP) competition. All competition starts at the Club level, then to District Level and then the ACBL Finals. In the Denver area 3 clubs held qualifying events this year - Denver House of Cards, Denver Metropolitan Bridge Studio and The Bridge Club. The competition is under the jurisdiction of the ACBL, but there are some differences in the Conditions of Contest from District to District. However the stratifications are the same throughout the United States. The stratifications at all 3 levels:

Flight A - Over 2,000 master points at June 1, 2009

Flight B - 500 to 2,000 MP at 6/1/09

Flight C - Less that 500 MP at 6/1/09

In District 17, which covers Colorado, New Mexico, Arizona and parts of Wyoming and Nevada, the next step for pairs who qualified at the Club level, is the District 17 NAP Finals. The District Finals will be held at the Ruidoso, New Mexico, Regional during the week of October 5-11, 2009. The top three pairs from each strat at District qualify for the ACBL NAP Finals to be played in Reno, Nevada, at the North American Bridge Championship (NABC) in March 2010.

After three card Drury, south bid game in spades. West lead the king of hearts which was ducked, and west shifted to the 10 of clubs which won and west continued with the seven of clubs to the nine and trumped by south. South now won the ace of hearts and trumped a heart. North played the ace of spades and saw east show out. South finessed the nine of spades, which west won with the queen, and played another club, which was ducked to the jack and trumped.

It was now too late for the defense. South now ran his good spades pitching diamonds from the dummy and east was squeezed in the minors so north south made four spades, an impossible contract! West had to break up the squeeze by playing diamonds at some point, but he was reluctant to break that suit.


