Denver's New Top Master Point Holder: Brad Moss (courtesy of Peggy Ware)

When 2017 Bermuda Bowl Champion, Brad Moss, moved to Denver 6 years ago as a new quadragenarian, he hoped to convince his LA wife that she could survive cold weather. Brad had recently closed his hedge fund business and was eager to leave the posh and deceptively laid-back world of Marin County, CA. The couple and their two young children visited several cities. With Brad, a NYC native of almost 35 years, and Jen, a Valley girl, finding a compromise relocation point presented no small challenge. As luck would have it, the two fell in love with the mile-high city and since have embraced it as their permanent home.

Brad plays bridge at a level and intensity that few can grasp. His imagination, tenacity and work ethic have led him to amass a stunning list of bridge accomplishments, including ACBL and WBF Grand Life Master, 2x World Champion, 12x National Champion, King of Bridge and Player of the Year. His successes away from the bridge table as a market maker, trader and hedge fund manager are similarly impressive. Brad's talent for market analysis gave him healthy financial independence by the age of 25 and enabled him to retire from the financial world at the age of 40. Brad now splits his time between fatherhood and professional bridge.

While remaining a fierce and dangerous competitor, Brad's personality has evolved and mellowed over the years. Once known for his exuberance and loud mouth, Brad has managed to shake off much of the brashness of his youth. Graying hair, an amazing wife, and parenthood have accentuated his humility, generous spirit, and sense of humor. These less-publicized qualities define him more completely and make him a deeply cherished partner, friend, teammate, father and mentor.

Brad volunteers a considerable amount of time promoting and enhancing bridge. In 2015, he devoted countless hours to helping Boye Brogeland take down top pairs long suspected of collusive cheating. He now serves on the ACBL's Anti-Cheating Commission, working with the organization to make it more proactive and effective at policing the game. He also serves on the board of the US Bridge Federation, and does many other things such as chairing ethics committees, giving talks at regionals, playing in Pro Am events, and mentoring other players.

First is the Speaker program where we get 5 Pro's and highly distinguished teachers to provide a 30-minute lecture on a subject and then conduct a Q&A... if you have not taken advantage of this in previous years I highly encourage you to do so at the upcoming Regional. There will be Poster boards around announcing the person, subject, time and location each day. The second item I would like to highlight is the Pro-Am game that happens early in the tournament... if you are an "Amateur" I would like to recommend you take advantage of this opportunity to play with a "Pro".

To wrap this all up I would like to take a minute and ask any and all of you to please bring anything that comes to mind about the regional to a board member... we work very hard to make this tournament as enjoyable as possible to everyone but we are also human and might miss something... so please contact/inform a board member on anything that comes to mind that is tournament related... District 17 Update

District 17 is comprised of 21 units, one of which is Denver Unit 361. The other units are from AZ, CO, NM, Las Vegas, El Paso, Moab Utah & southern WY. The district currently has 9075 members & of that Denver's membership is 1375. Beginning in 2019, the size of the board is reduced from 14 to 10 & Unit 361 will only have one representative. Jerry Ranney will be leaving. He has served on the board for 9 years and has held many positions including President. He will be greatly missed and we thank him for his years of service and leadership.

Due to the high costs of producing & mailing a paper newsletter, last year D17 decided to leave the Western Conference (other member districts are D21, northern CA & D22 southern CA excluding Los Angeles) & produce its own online edition. In February 2017, the other units agreed and changed the purpose of the WC to run only the STAC

(Sectional Tournaments at Clubs) 3 times a year & to allocate the proceeds to the Districts after expenses. D17 changed its decision to leave the Western Conference & will share in the STAC revenue. This money will help fund the costs of our online publication still named the Scorecard. District members receive an email bimonthly letting them know that the new publication is available. If you are not receiving these notifications, please log into the ACBL website and update your information. In addition in those months where the Scorecard is not published, a short newsletter, Bridge Buzz is sent.

In addition to the email notifications, D17 developed apps for both the Android & Apple devices. These are free! With your device just go to the store or market place & download them. The D17 board is meeting again at the Colorado Springs Regional in October. At that time we will be considering how best to support the units. Possibly a

reduced sanction fee or additional grants to the units (or both) will be discussed. Another new upcoming possibility is that the District will run a regional in Las Vegas in the summer of 2020 instead of the unit.

New Player Development

A high priority for the Unit 361 Board of Directors is to increase the number of newcomer and intermediate level bridge players who regularly compete in tournaments. Recent actions to accomplish this include the following:

- Beginning in fall 2018, included a special game for players with 0-10 points at the Unit's I/N tournament
- Beginning in 2019, having a special I/N day that will include discounts, promotions, and prizes at the Rocky Mountain Regional
- Are considering whether or not to offer a non-life master regional in conjunction with one of the regularly scheduled sectional tournaments
- Beginning in 2019, will have a 0-50
 masterpoint section (if registration is
 sufficient) at the Rocky Mountain Regional
- 5. Beginning at the Summer 2018 Sectional, added a 0-20 masterpoint section with a hand discussion following the event, and changed the 299er events to non-life master events.

The Board's objective is to try to create a tournament atmosphere that is not threatening to newer players and provides them opportunities to make connections with their peers as well improve their bridge. Continuing efforts to support newer players include the pro/am event at the regional tournament, youth and junior discounts, educational speakers at the regional tournament, and \$10 entry fees at the I/N tournament including lunch. In the past, mentoring and coaching programs have been offered.
