


only weeks away, so mark your calendars and lineup your partners for pair and team events. See the schedule on Page 3. Lets encourage all of our bridge friends to attend.

Congratulations to Denver's newest ACBLcertified teachers

At the recent NABC in Austin, Shelbie Bastiaans and Sheryl Siegel went through the training, passed the tests, and became Denver's newest ACBL-certified teachers. They join three other Denver teachers in achieving this credential.

Sheryl and Shelbie began teaching at the beginning of the pandemic, at the request of Elly Larson, owner of Denver Metro Bridge Studio. To date, they have taught more than 120



students, ages 7 to 90. Their success encouraged them to obtain the ACBL Best Practice Teacher Certification. This certification is available only at NABCs. The entire process includes a Basic Bridge Knowledge Test, a three-day workshop, and several demonstration lessons given to fellow workshop participants. The final lesson is graded by the workshop facilitators and Patty Tucker, whom you may recognize as a leading ACBL teacher and developer of several bridge courses (Learn Bridge in a Day, and Bridge in a Day).

Shelbie and Sheryl have also developed their own Quick Bridge program, they are BIAD-certified teachers, and they are participating in the BridgeWhiz program.

Congratulations! (and belated congratulations to our other ACBL-certified teachers).

The Jan Janitschke Award

In September 2019 Denver Unit 361 lost a bridge legend when Jan Janitschke passed away. An ACBL Grand Life Master winning four National Championships, Jan amassed 19,038 masterpoints during his career. He was also designated a World Master by the World Bridge Federation and placed 4th in the 1982 World Pairs Championship.



To honor her late husband, Unit member Bonnie Smith generously offered to establish an annual award

in Jan's memory. She was particularly focused on furthering Jan's interest in bridge education. A committee was formed to pursue her idea and the "Jan Janitschke Award" was born. The award is presented annually "In recognition of outstanding teaching or mentoring contributions to the membership of Denver Bridge Unit 361."

We were proud to present this prestigious award to our first recipient, Curt Soloff, for his achievements during 2020. (See the October, 2021 issue of Table Talk for a full report on Curt and the honor he received.)

It will soon be time to choose our 2021 honoree. Nominations will be solicited from the entire Unit membership with the winner chosen from these submissions by the Unit Board. We will be asking for your nominations in early February, but please start thinking now about who you would like to see honored with this award. Our criteria for nomination includes the following:

- What has this person done for advancing bridge education and mentoring in the Denver area?
- How has this person impacted you and/or the bridge community?
- Who has contributed time and energy to help less-experienced Unit members become better, more confident bridge players?

Complete details about the selection process and the submission forms will be available on the denverbridge.org website when the nomination window opens in early February. Watch your emails for further information. We had terrific participation last year and are hoping even more members will be part of this important event this year.

Grand National Teams

Want a chance to win an entry to a National event? Need some gold points? Flight C players want to play in a regional event for free? You are in luck! The Denver 2021 Regional has been named as the host for the Grand National Teams (GNT) District 17 finals. The event will take place on May 28 – 29, 2022.

The GNTs consist of four flights: 1) Open – participants can have an unlimited number of masterpoints; 2) Flight A – players with 0 - 6000 masterpoints; 3) Flight B – limited to 0 – 2500 masterpoints and; 4) Flight C – players with 0 - 500 masterpoints, who are not a Life Master. All masterpoint totals are determined by what a player had as of August 6, 2021.

All first-place teams at the District 17 Finals will receive a \$2000 subsidy from District 17 to attend the National finals July 13 -17 in Providence, RI. The first two days of entry fees for Flights A, B & C are waived by ACBL. District 17 covers the entry fees for the Championship Flight and for any Flight A, B or C teams that progress to the third day and further.

If more than eight teams compete in either Flight B or Flight C, the District 17 can have both the first and second place teams compete at the national level. There is currently no provision for stipends for second place teams.

Qualification to compete at the District 17 finals is required for Championship, Flight A and Flight B players. ACBL has stipulated the club qualifying period ends February 28, 2022. Flight C teams can register and play without qualifying. **Pre-registration by May 15, 2022 is** required. Championship, Flight A and Flight B teams should mail \$112 (made out to District 17) to Bonnie Bagley, 7285 Ross Drive, Colorado Springs, CO 80920 before that date. The entry fee for Flight C is being covered by District 17, so the team captain should email the roster to Bonnie Bagley at bon1bon@comcast.net prior to the deadline.


will review the Am's convention card, talk and then play a game with them. A short hand analysis and reception will follow the game. This is a special opportunity for the Ams to play with the best!

Support Your Local Clubs

In these difficult times many of the social aspects of gathering to play bridge have been lost. There are many excuses...oh, I don't want to expose myself to infection; it is so easy to walk from my bed/chair/couch/table to the computer and play online; it costs less; I do not have to drive in bad weather; the game times do not suit my schedule; I do not have to wear a mask at home; I don't have to worry about reneging online; Very few people call the director if I do not alert a conventional bid; In other words I do not have to use my brain to play like a robot online and seldom have to suffer the wrath of my partner when I make stupid mistakes. However, my game tends to get a little sloppy, the defensive strategies are diminished and all I can do is grumble at the cat/dog/goldfish that everybodies' game is suffering.

In order to support your local clubs when you are playing online, look in the ACBL World section of BBO games offered for games titled ACBLSYC and try to play in at least one of these a week and a portion of your entry fee will be returned to the local club at which you used to play face-to-face.

Most of the local bridge clubs are open for face-to-face games, and those of us who have been vaccinated are renewing old friendships, interacting with real people, trying to get back to some form of normal, everyday life, and, indirectly, improving our standard of play. Teachers are teaching, mentors are mentoring, and we are all trying to sever the roots that are anchoring our bodies to our chairs at home.

Your district unit is also trying to reverse this trend of absentee players by providing local sanctioned tournaments, in surroundings conducive to Table Talk with friends, all conducted with respect to local, state and ACBL requirements for health safety.
